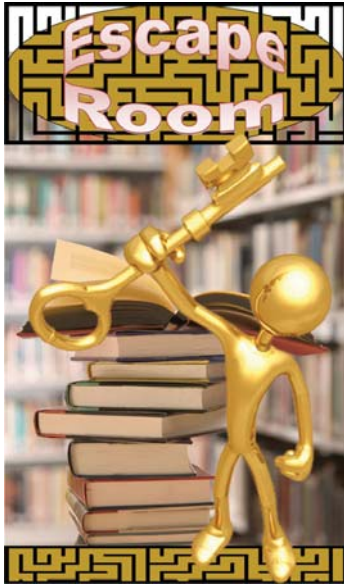


# SPRING IS IN THE AIR!

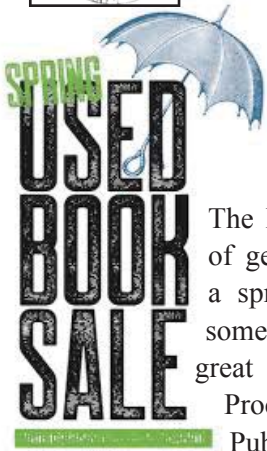

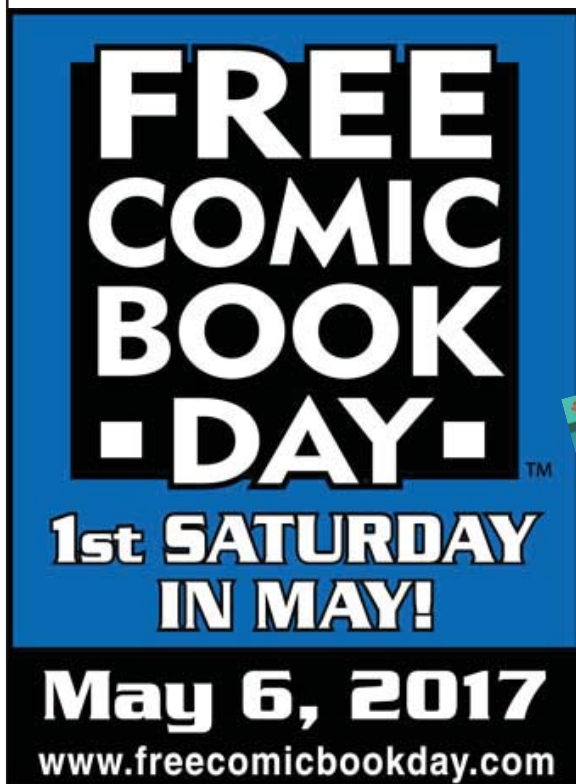

Taking of photos or video by anyone other than library staff is prohibited without prior consent by library administration.
