All ages are eligible to participate even newborns can be part of our Summer Reading Program as we explore “A Universe of Stories”. Registration is available online at www.apld.info with Beanstack, reading program software that allows individuals or families to log their progress and earn badges in the process. Want to keep a paper log of your reading? No problem! Pick one up at the library starting June 1st or join us on our big launch event June 8th. Registration and additional information will be available on that day.

Adults and Teens can choose between reading by the minute or by the book to reach their goal while children earn points for various reading practices to finish the program. Early literacy provides building blocks for learning in young children. For teens it broadens their knowledge and helps develop critical thinking skills. Of course for adults and all ages reading is a relaxing and entertaining activity.

During the Summer Reading Program we will be measuring our reads! Will APLD summer readers make it to the edge of the universe or beyond? Be sure to participate and help us reach the stars! Measure your books at the Circulation Desk when you come to return them. Then watch our rocket launch and climb to the sky.

In Honoring Loved Ones

Our Memorial Book program has enabled us to be the thankful host to many hundreds of donated books in memory of valued patrons over the years. Friends and family choose book subjects significant to their loved ones and those books are dedicated in their memory, leaving a legacy that circulates throughout the community for years to come.

Recently, two valued community members passed, and both requested, in lieu of flowers, donations be made to our Library. Over \$2500 in donations by more than 40 individuals has enabled us to order 250 books to date and still counting.

From the bottom of our hearts, we extend our thanks to Dolores Raila Abderholden and Barbara Wetherbee. Dolores, a resident of Antioch since 1958, was a lifelong advocate for women’s rights and her request was that donations be spent on books to support women’s history and literature. 


