

# 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten

## A New Adventure Begins This October

Little readers will be treated to a cast of new characters when the Children's Department unveils the new 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten program this fall. Research has shown that young children need six skills to be ready to read: Print motivation, Print awareness, Vocabulary, Phonological awareness, Narrative skills, and Letter knowledge. Sharing books with the youngest of children is the best way to instill a love of reading. It also begins the journey to prepare them for the skills they will need to start reading on their own. Starting this October, this beloved early literacy program will have a new face, with early literacy tips, new prizes and new characters to share with your children (from infants until they enter kindergarten). Parents can begin registering their preschool age children beginning October 1.
